



The Tom Lowe Atlanta-Fulton County Water Treatment Plant is located at 9750 Spruill Road, in Johns Creek, GA. It is jointly-owned by Fulton County and the City of Atlanta and operated by joint venture partner, Veolia Water/Khafra. The facility has 90 million gallons per day ("MGD") permitted production capacity. The raw water supply for the Atlanta/Fulton Plant is obtained from the Chattahoochee River.

The Johns Creek Environmental Campus (JCEC) is located at 8100 Holcomb Bridge Road, Roswell, GA. JCEC, completed in the fall of 2009, has a permitted capacity of 15 MGD and provides service to approximately 32 square miles or 29% of the North Fulton County area. JCEC is one of the largest membrane bioreactor systems in North America.



The Camp Creek WRF is located at 7520 Cochran Road, Atlanta, GA. This plant treats wastewater from all the residential, commercial and industrial users in the South Fulton County, Union City, Fairburn, Palmetto, East Point and portions of Atlanta. Permitted for 24 MGD average monthly.
